From the Pastor's Desk...

Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead... (1 Peter 1:3).

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia! And because He is risen, hope lives!

For the people of God, our living hope is not just a future reality, it is a resurrected person. Our living hope sits at the right hand of God the Father almighty, still bearing the nail holes and spear wound, but healed and glorified. This living hope visits His frightened disciples on Easter Sunday evening. He stands before Peter, the one who had failed Him by denying Him, and He speaks to him the same as He speaks to the rest of the disciples. "Peace be with you!" Mission of the Community Engagement Ministry – To be Jesus' servants to meet physical, spiritual, and relational needs of the community.

Slow Cooking for Freedom House: We are looking to prepare and serve a meal at the Freedom House on April 23, 2024. Are you familiar with Freedom House? It is a shelter to help homeless families in Green Bay and is located at 2997 St. Anthony Drive. It is the only shelter in Green Bay that will accept entire families.

As a congregation there are many ways that you can help, including:

- Slow Cooker Meal On the display in the narthex there are recipes for Slow Cooker Homemade Macaroni & Cheese and Chicken & Broccoli Pasta. Please sign up to make one of these in your slow cooker and bring it to church before 12:00 noon on Tuesday, April 23rd. Please put your name on your slow cooker so we can return it to you.
- Slow Cooker Applesauce Please take a recipe card and make some applesauce prior to the meal. Deliver it to church before 12:00 noon on Monday, April 22nd, so we can chill it before serving it.
- 3. Sign up to help pack the meal, transport it, serve it, and clean up at the shelter. All volunteers need to sign up by April 10th as Freedom House asks to do background checks on our volunteers. We will meet at church at 3:45 p.m. on Tuesday, April 23rd. We will serve the meal from 5:00 to 6:00 p.m.

Hope also requested a Thrivent Action Team Card to allow us to purchase a slow cooker for each of the families that are at the Freedom House. We hope to help them out when they move out of homelessness and into a place of their own. We will also purchase some crafts for the kids, and we are partnering with Angels of Hope 4K students and Green Bay Trinity Lutheran 5th graders to provide cookies for the meal as well.

College Students: If you are a college student or have one in your family approaching final exams, please pass on their name and address to Kim Thompson, CEM Chairperson.

Hope Squares to Share: Whether you are already a whiz at crocheting or you have always wanted to learn - we have a project for you! Hope Squares to Share is a project to make blankets for our Foundations program for new babies. Extra blankets can also be packaged for mission gifts. We plan to meet at least monthly in (the meeting room, the fellowship hall, or the youth room) for making

granny squares. When we have enough squares, we will join them together. You may either crochet with us at the church or grab your supplies and crochet at home. Yarn and 5mm "H" crochet hooks will be provided.

We will meet for the first time on Saturday, April 13, 2024, from 2:00 to 3:30 p.m. Depending upon interest and the schedule preferences expressed, we can set up a calendar for regular meetings. Hope's Health Corner

It's that time of year again – bring out the dust rags, brooms, and cleaning supplies and get ready for some spring cleaning! While a typical clean might include wiping down counters, scrubbing toilets, dusting, and vacuuming, you might also add in some deeper cleaning tasks – things like power washing the exterior of the house, reorganizing the garage, or a bigger cleaning project.

There's one additional item you should keep an eye on while cleaning, and it's not one that comes to

mind with the standard cleanup – mold. Molds are part of the natural environment and help break down leaves, dead trees, and other plants and materials. Molds reproduce by tiny spores which are not seen by the eye,



and they float through outdoor and indoor air.

There are many different types of molds, and they all grow when mold spores land on moist or wet surfaces. When molds take hold and grow indoors, they have the potential to cause health problems. Most often, the symptoms are most similar to those seen with allergies – things like coughing, sneezing, a runny nose, watery eyes, or a skin rash. They can also cause asthma attacks in those who have asthma and are allergic to mold. Molds gradually destroy whatever they are growing on as well, so it's important to clean up mold to preserve your health, as well as prevent damage to your home and furnishings!

It is impossible to remove all mold (recall that the spores are both outdoors and inside). However, they cannot grow if moisture is not present. If mold growth happens in your home, it's important to clean up the mold **and** fix the water problem that caused it to grow. Once this has been taken care of, mold can be cleaned up.

If mold is in a small area, you may use a bleach solution (four parts water to one part bleach), spray the solution, and use a scrub brush. Another option is to use hydrogen peroxide, using a 3 to 10% concentration. Hydrogen peroxide is effective for removing molds from kitchen appliances, bathroom fixtures, walls, and floors. If mold is covering a larger area (larger than a 3-foot by 3-foot patch), you should consult a professional. They will have the proper supplies to remove the mold effectively.

To keep mold away, it's important to control moisture in your home. You may want to consider purchasing a dehumidifier for your home (make sure humidity does not rise above 50%). Keep fabrics and surfaces dry. Consider improving ventilation in your home with the use of bathroom and kitchen fans when the humidity is high. Open your windows on dry, breezy days.
