Hope's Health Corner

"Where there is no guidance, a people falls, but in an abundance of counselors there is safety." Proverbs 11:14

We hope this message finds you well and enjoying the final days of summer! As we begin to look toward the start of the school year and the shift into fall routines, we want to take a moment to talk about something that has been showing up in local news and public health circles lately—**measles**.

Wisconsin has recently recorded its **first measles cases of 2025**—nine individuals in Oconto County, all exposed during out-of-state travel and from a single source. No public exposure sites have been identified so far, and public health officials assess the **risk to the community as low**. Still, this event serves as a crucial reminder—especially as the school year begins.

Measles, also known as rubeola, is a highly contagious virus that can spread very quickly, especially in places where people gather closely—like schools, shopping centers, and community events. It starts with symptoms that may seem like a regular cold: fever, cough, runny nose, and red, watery eyes. But what makes measles stand out is the rash that follows, usually starting at the hairline and moving downward. The fever can get quite high, and it's not uncommon to feel extremely tired and uncomfortable for several days.

Most healthy people recover fully, but measles can lead to serious complications, especially for young children, pregnant women, and those with weakened immune systems. Pneumonia, brain swelling (also called encephalitis), and even death can result in severe cases. That's why prevention is so important.



The good news? **Measles is preventable.** The MMR vaccine (measles, mumps, rubella) is safe and effective, and it's been a major reason why we've seen fewer cases in recent decades. However, with travel increasing

and vaccine rates dropping slightly in some communities, we've seen a small but concerning rise in measles outbreaks.

Here are a few steps we can all take:

- Check your vaccination status. Adults born before 1957 are generally considered immune, but others may need a booster or verification of immunity.
- Talk to your healthcare provider if you're unsure about your immunization history or planning to travel.
- Be mindful of symptoms—especially in children. If your little ones have a fever and rash, call your doctor before going to a clinic or hospital to prevent spreading illness.

As we face health concerns like this, let's respond not with fear, but with wisdom and grace. If you have questions or would like to talk more about measles, vaccines, or anything else health-related, Leighann and I are always here for you. Whether it is offering information, praying together, or just listening, please don't hesitate to reach out.
