Scrip: \$1,081.36 year-to-date. Scrip sales are the only extra fundraising activity for Hope's general fund and \$8,000 is included as a budget line item. If you're not already using scrip, give it a try for things that are in your regular spending - groceries, gas, home maintenance, etc. In-person sales are between services on Sunday, or text/call Sue or Judy or email hopedeperescrip@gmail.com for mid-week sales or questions. Pick up an order form at the scrip desk and check out the cards typically in stock - literally hundreds more available online at www.raiseright.com. Youth families and parochial school families are eligible for a 50/50 rebate split - pick up sign-up forms at the scrip desk anytime.

The DPCO Food Pantry was able to feed 616 individuals in January (198 households) including 250 children and 366 adults. Current needs include Baked Beans, Pork & Beans, Hamburger Helper, and Paper Towels. They DO NOT need any canned corn, canned peas, or canned beans. The Food Pantry is open for donations Monday through Friday from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon. Distributions take place on Wednesdays from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon. The nonperishable food collection barrel is always in the coat room at Hope, and we emphasize the pantry collections on the 4th Sunday of each month (February 18th and 22nd).
